## Reasons for Neighborhood Watch

- Meet your neighbors, talk about your concerns regarding crime and safety
- Develop awareness about a particular concern or issue
- Collect data from police reports, observations or media reports
- Develop strategies to raise the level of awareness about identified concerns among your neighbors
- Set the "tone" for your neighborhood. What activities are you as neighbors willing to tolerate to take place in, on or around your top investments: Family and Home
- Assist law enforcement by becoming extra **eyes and ears** and report what you see and hear; if you didn't call it in, it didn't happen!
- Share the responsibility of preventing crime
- Keep the program active-don't become the street that cries wolf and let your program fizzle
- Remember that criminals are always watching. They know if you are active in crime prevention or not
- Become better prepared for any disaster by knowing and helping your neighbors
